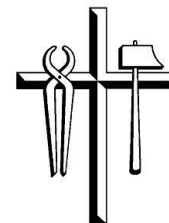

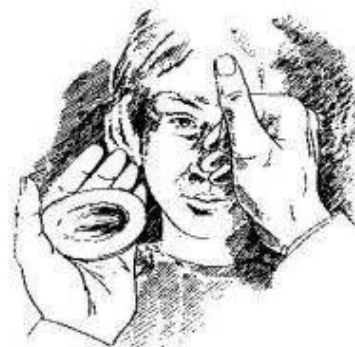

The Stations of the Cross is a Lenten devotion to Jesus’ Passion and Death. At each station we reflect prayerfully upon Jesus’ suffering, death, and resurrection. **Please join us on Fridays during Lent at 7.30pm.**



Ash Wednesday begins Lent, a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in preparation for the celebration of Easter. We remember Jesus’ forty days in the desert. During this Lenten season, let us strive to turn from our selfish ways, draw closer to God and grow in compassion for all in need.

In our parish the service of **signing with the ashes** will take place during 9.15am and 7.30pm Mass.

Additionally there will be a short service with

the signing with the ashes at 2pm for junior children from St Peter’s School. Parents are welcome.

On Ash Wednesday abstinence and fasting are to be observed. Abstinence means not eating meat. Fasting means that one eats only one full meal in a day, with no food in-between meals. It is understood that two other meals, if one eats three meals a day, should not total one full meal. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year. The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year.
